

MUSEUM INTERPRETATION WORKSHOPS SCHEDULE & PARTICIPANTS Salt Lake City & Provo – 2023-2024

The Museum Interpretation Workshop program is a series of 5 full-day linked workshops that offer participants hands-on learning experiences about museum interpretation and exhibit development. Participants learn how to research, design, and produce their own interpretive exhibits, receive resources and equipment to help them do so, and develop lasting relationships along the way. Participants will work independently on their own exhibit project (3-10+ objects), supported by workshop facilitators as needed. Workshop facilitators will visit each exhibit prototype to give feedback before completion of final project.

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1) WORKSHOP #1 – October 23, 2023 – Telling Our Stories: Introduction to Museum Interpretation

Activities: Participants will:

- Learn about national standards for museum interpretation
- Understand the concepts, elements, and evaluation of interpretive exhibits
- Discover tools to plan and manage their own interpretive exhibit project

2) WORKSHOP #2 – November 13, 2023 – Finding Our Stories: Researching Collections & Communities

Activities: Participants will learn to:

- Locate appropriate published and unpublished sources that yield relevant information
- Evaluate sources to establish their accuracy, authenticity, bias, and significance
- Conduct archival and community research to place objects and stories in context

3) WORKSHOP #3 – January 8, 2024 – Designing Our Stories: Well-Structured Exhibits

Activities: Participants will learn to:

- Hone a theme around which to focus an exhibit, supported by well-selected objects and materials
- Structure and design an interpretive exhibit
- Exhibit objects attractively and safely

4) WORKSHOP #4 – February 12, 2024 – Writing Our Stories: Exhibit Labels

Activities: Participants will learn to:

- Assemble information from various sources to craft compelling and credible narratives
- Write different types of labels and supporting texts that work together to tell a story
- Produce professional-looking, low-tech labels

5) WORKSHOP #5 – March 11, 2024 – Teaching Our Stories: Museum Education

Activities: Participants will learn to:

- Relate current educational philosophy and basic learning theories to their museum
- Apply a variety of tools to educate in their museum (labels, tours, self-guides, public programs, etc.)
- Teach in the museum through informal interactive tours
- Develop self-guides of their exhibit to enhance visitor experiences
