At a time when much of rural Utah is reinventing itself, Crossroads takes a broad look at rural America and examines evolving landscapes and identities. Come find out how change has transformed rural America and how rural Americans are evolving for the future.

- Change in Washington County: Then 'til Now gives an overview of the forces that transformed this corner of southern Utah from a remote agrarian colony to one of the fastest growing populations centers in the West.
- Working Together is Key to Managing Change features the entwined history of the Silver Reef and Leeds communities to show the benefits of working together to overcome challenges and manage change. Housed in the newly-renovated Rice Bank Building, the structure itself illustrates the ideas of adaptation and cooperation that are central to the exhibit.
